



PRECARIOUS – Dependent on circumstances beyond one's control. Dependent on the will or pleasure of another, liable to be withdrawn or lost at the will of another. Exposed to or involving danger, dangerous, perilous, risky.

To say that the musical career of singer/songwriter **MICK PEALING** is “precarious” is both accurate and misleading.

Mick first came to prominence in 1975 when he, and other musicians from his neighbourhood in Adelaide, including songwriter/guitarist Andy Durant and guitarist Malcolm Eastick, formed Stars. By 1980 with three albums, various hit singles and several thousand live shows including supports for Joe Cocker, The Beach Boys and Linda Ronstadt to their credit, circumstances beyond his control set Mick off on the first of many steps of his musical journey.

From 1980, Mick was the lead vocalist in a variety of bands including Mick Pealing and The Ideals, The Spaniards (with Billy Miller), the New Frontier, Mick Pealing and the Method – even a stint singing the blues with his friend, former Stars guitarist Mal Eastick. Mick was now gaining a strong reputation as one of the most versatile vocalists in the industry.

Since the late 80s Mick has forged a strong and highly regarded solo career that comprises live performances, session work for television and radio and corporate showcases.

This collection of songs on his first solo release, *Precarious*, highlights Mick's 30-year musical passage through a collection of songs - some penned by Mick, a couple of his personal favourites and others that take us back to his musical beginnings.
